Agenda 1. Proposal for Improvement in Mentor-Mentee System

1.1. Structured Matching

 Detailed Profiles: Create detailed profiles for mentors and mentees, including academic interests, career goals, and personal preferences. This will facilitate more effective and compatible pairings.



Matching Criteria: Implement a standardized matching process based on these profiles
to ensure that mentor-mentee pairs are well-aligned in terms of their interests and goals.

1.2. Defined Goals and Expectations

- Initial Meetings: Conduct initial meetings between mentors and mentees to set clear objectives and expectations. Discuss and document goals, preferred communication methods, and meeting schedules.
- Goal Setting: Encourage mentees to establish SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-bound) for their mentoring relationship, with support from their mentors.

1.3. Regular Monitoring

- Progress Reports: Implement a system for regular progress reports from both mentors and mentees. Reports should track progress towards goals, challenges encountered, and areas needing improvement.
- Feedback Mechanisms: Establish mechanisms for mentees to provide feedback on their mentoring experience. This can include surveys or scheduled feedback sessions with program coordinators.

1.4. Mentor Training

- Training Workshops: Provide training workshops for mentors to develop their skills in areas such as effective communication, goal-setting, and providing constructive feedback.
- Resource Materials: Develop and distribute resource materials, including handbooks and online guides, to assist mentors in their roles.
