### 3. **Increased Engagement:**

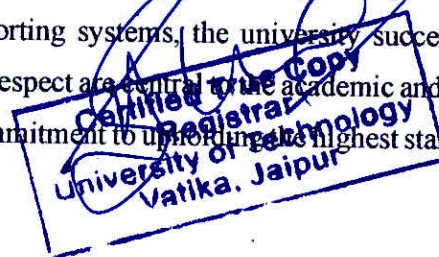
- Workshops, seminars, and digital modules received high participation rates, with most attendees actively engaging and contributing insights.

### **Conclusion:**

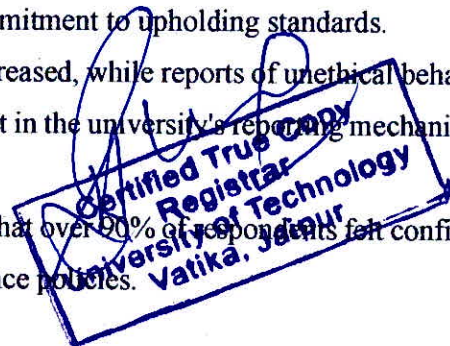

  - Reports of academic misconduct decreased, while reports of unethical behavior were handled promptly, building trust in the university's reporting mechanisms.
2. **Improved Awareness and Compliance:**
- Feedback from the survey indicated that over 90% of respondents felt confident in their understanding of zero-tolerance policies.
